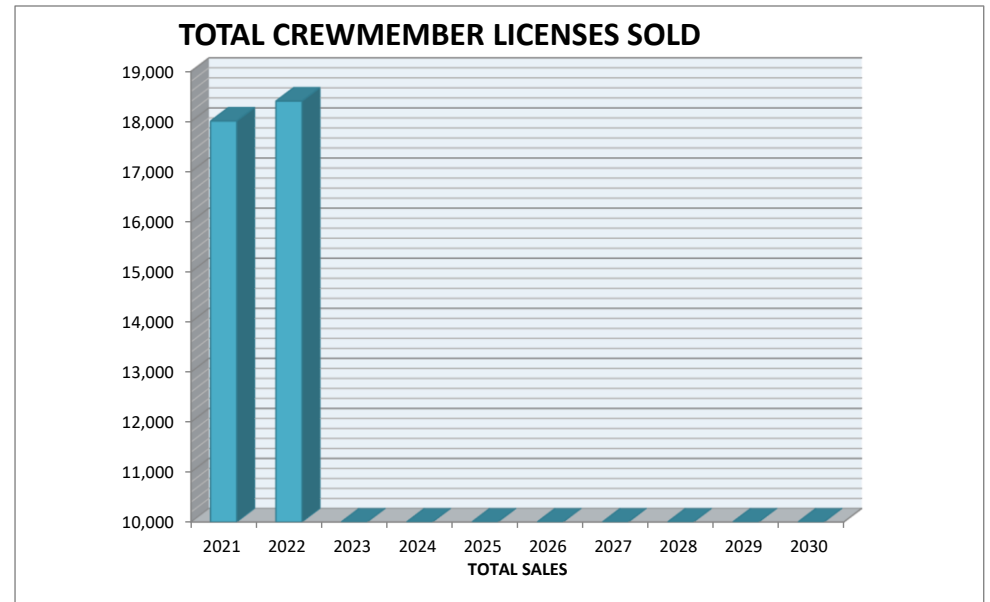
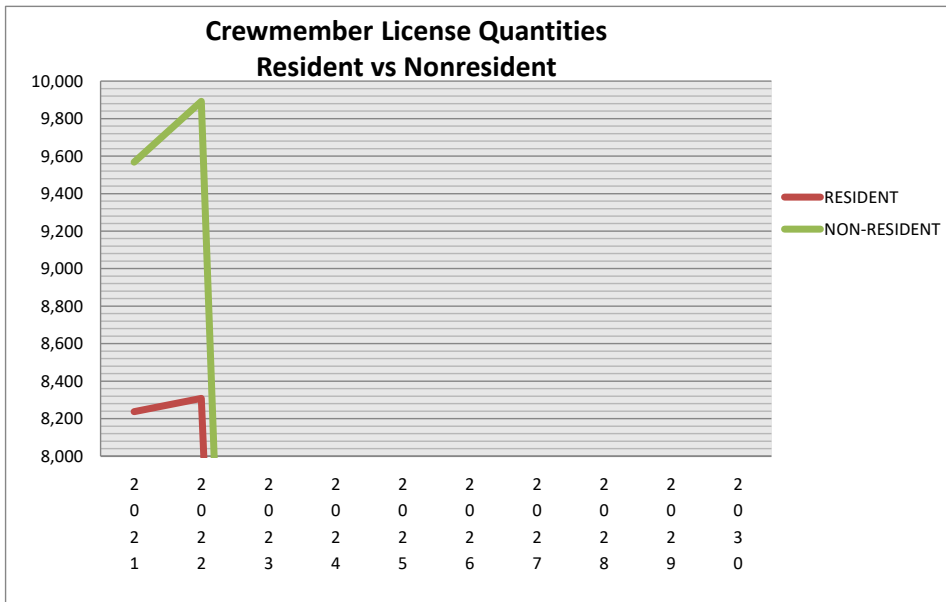

Nonresident crewmember license fees increased in 2014, 2016 & 2019

A 7-day crewmember license was made available to residents and non-residents beginning 2005. Crewmembers began purchasing multiple 7-day licenses in lieu of an annual license. In 2015 a bill was passed restricting the purchase of 7-day licenses to one per year.
